- The school follows both Devon and Plymouth pathways for identifying and supporting children with SEND. Please ask your child's teacher or SENDCO about this.

- We will invite you to come and talk to us if your child is frequently having difficulty following class and school rules, so that we can work together to improve the situation. This will ensure a successful learning experience for your child and others in the class

- Any worries, queries please feel free to ask the teacher or office for a chat/appointment time (after school is better unless it is urgent).

Behaviour

Class Homework Arrangements

- > Set on Wednesday and due the following Monday.
- Daily reading.
- Maths worksheet revising what we have done in class / areas the children need to revise.
- > SPAG homework set every week (ranges from 10 questions to 50)
- Spellings
- NumBots, TTRockstars.
- ▶ Topic homework (set once a term)

How can you help your child?

- Listen to your child read/share a book/talk about what you have read together/ask lots of questions to develop comprehension. Reading books and reading diaries

How will your child be assessed?

- ▶ Working above ARE at greater depth
- ▶ Working at ARE
- ▶ Working below ARE

SATs paper score will be converted into a raw score and standardised. If your child has a score above 100 then they are AT ARE. If they are above 115 then they are above ARE (working at greater depth).

Progress is based on their KSI SATs result.
